Analysis of the Cohort

Autumn - of the 26 children: Nursery Class

- 13 girls / 13boys
- 0 have English as an additional language
- 26 children have English as a first language; 7 have internal identified speech and language delay, 3 children with Inclusion funding (2: Level 2 1 EHCP application)
- 15 currently have attendance below 90%
- 6 currently have attendance below 75%
- 5 children have attainment levels significantly below typical development bands across all PRIME areas & L+M
- 0 are new to the school in September, all were previously eligible for 2 year old funding

Spring- of the 25 children: Nursery Class

- 12 girls / 13 boys
- 0 have English as an additional language
- 25 children have English as a first language; 3 have identified **SALT** speech and language delay, 3 children with Inclusion funding (2 at Level 1; 1 at Level 2)
- 21 currently have attendance below 90%
- 11 currently have attendance below 75%
- 3 children have attainment levels significantly below typical development bands across all PRIME areas & L+M
- 6 children accessing additional support through Accelerated Progress Tracker.
- 2 are new to the school since September (and have not yet attended), 1 child new to school Spring term.
- 23 were previously eligible for 2 year old funding
- 12 families supported (CP- Early Help)

Includes 1 child accessing provision in Explorers' classroom

Spring- of the 7 children: Explorers

- 4 girls /2 boys
- 0 have English as an additional language
- 7 children have English as a first language; 6 have internal identified speech and language delay, 0 children with Inclusion funding
- 5 currently have attendance below 90%
- 3 currently have attendance below 75%
- 2 children have attainment levels significantly below typical development bands across all PRIME areas & L+M
- 1 is new to the school in November 2022, 6 were previously eligible for 2 year old funding

Summer- of the 30 children: Nursery Class

- 14 girls / 15 boys
- 0 have English as an additional language



- 30 children have English as a first language; 3 have identified **SALT** speech and language delay, 3 children with Inclusion funding (2 at Level 1; 1 at Level 2)
- 24 currently have attendance below 90%
- 12 currently have attendance below 75%
- 3 children have attainment levels significantly below typical development bands across all PRIME areas & L+M
- 6 children accessing additional support through Accelerated Progress Tracker.
- 12 families supported (CP- Early Help)

Includes 1 child accessing provision in Explorers classroom

Summer- of the 17 children: Explorers & Garden

- 10 girls /7 boys
- 0 have English as an additional language
- 17 children have English as a first language; 6 have internal identified speech and language delay, 1 child with Inclusion funding
- 11 currently have attendance below 90%
- 7 currently have attendance below 75%
- 2 children have attainment levels significantly below typical development bands across all PRIME areas & L+M
- 17 were previously eligible for 2 year old funding

Areas of need identified to support children eligible for EYPP

Leadership and management:

- All children eligible for EYPP discussed in staff meeting and fortnightly SLT meeting
- High attaining children, including those eligible for EYPP, will be discussed as part of this meeting
- A sample of children eligible for EYPP are discussed at every moderation to ensure provision is discussed
- Home learning opportunities to support home learning
- Governors to attended training on the effective use of EYPP so that they can understand, monitor and challenge spending in the school

Annual predicted amount towards the cost of leadership time: £500

<u>Area of Need</u> Communication and Language

Provision:

- Inclusion leader signposting to speech and language telephone clinics and following up
- Wellcomm assessment completed for children with concerns
- Speech and language intervention groups planned and delivered x 4 weekly led by qualified practitioners (spring term)(summer term) with time to listen and respond.
- Accelerated Progress Tracker grids to drive adaptation of planning and provision
- Key person to support targets in play through 2 way interactions.
- Staff to introduce Makaton to support children at the early stages of English language acquisition and those who may have delayed language skills or be pre-verbal colourful semantics.
- Phase leader to monitor and coach staff to ensure individual needs are met and progress achieved
- Forest school sessions provide environment rich in 2 way dialogue.

Annual predicted amount:

Staff additional time to implement Wellcomm assessment outcomes and Identiplay. (Deprivation fund £1839)

Impact:

Clarity of strategy and progress in Accelerated progress tracker key group overview. St G Academy will use data to respond with immediate support for children to enable accelerated progress as required.

Costs subsidised by Deprivation Funding, Inclusion funding.

<u>Area of Need</u> *PSED – self regulation and making relationships*

Provision:

- Enhanced ratio for key groups (Hares)
- Forest school sessions

Annual predicted amount:

Staff costs from deprivation budget Forest school Training - £500

inclusion funding & Dep funding
Forest school staff cost- Autumn: £7533

Area of Need Attendance

Provision:

- Family Wellbeing Practitioner to provide daily call for absent children
- FWP release time to support attendance through regular fortnightly calls home
- Leadership team to monitor attendance half termly to ensure patterns are identified and funding to support can be allocated
- Strong links with children's centre-referrals made to provide support for identified families
- Rewards/Incentives for attendance processes to be considered and planned (Dec onwards).
- Summer term additional sessions provided for children recognised as low attendance.

Annual predicted amount:

School Budget

See above- 1 day per week. (£100 per day)



• Additional support for Transition to encourage attendance in school. See planner.

Area of Need Reading

Provision:

- Staff to audit books in the setting to ensure high quality and engage with families for favourites and those that relate to interests and link to focus teaching books
- Establish borrow boxes October 2022Castle; Spring 2023 Explorers
- EYPP children to be provided with book bags to borrow.
- Key people to record Tapestry story session so that stories can be accessed over the Christmas break/Summer holidays.
- Include a question on favourite books and stories on home visits, meeting sessions
- Story time to be a protected part of the day
- Story resources developed and used in key groups-will be used with families at 'stay & play'
- Summer Storytelling Stroll to be developed for Family engagement during the holiday

Annual predicted amount:

Resources to support home learning: £250. (Family Learning budget)

- Staff cover to provide/reinitiate recordable tapestry story sessions
- Contingency for individual resources
- Speaking to reading strategy
- Graduate competencies BGU students to have a clear focus on CLLD and reading.
- Book management £900
- 1 Book Hive £380

Expected Impact of Interventions

The impact of strategies in place will be monitored at regular points:

- Fortnightly leadership meetings
- Fortnightly staff planning meetings
- Fortnightly-Termly catch up calls with parents
- Termly data collections

Expected impact:

All children accessing EYPP funding will:

- Have improved attendance
- Make better than typical progress from their starting points in CLLD and literacy


